
Sunset Country Quilters' Guild Miniature Block of the Month 2022

Block 6 Crazy Ann

General Paper Piecing Preparation documentation can be found on the introduction page of the 2022 Mini BOM tab at sunsetcountryquilters.org.

The Crazy Ann block looks complicated but is made with 2 sizes of right-angle triangles we will call 'large' and 'small' as well as a 1" square. Four pairs of flying geese are arranged to make a pinwheel in the center which is put on point then framed with remaining triangles and corner squares.



If you are using alternating Light background fabrics, the background in this block is Light #2.

Light (Background #2) 2 – $2\frac{4}{2}$ squares cut diagonally once to make 4 'large' triangles 2 – $2^{\prime\prime}$ squares cut diagonally once to make 4 'small' triangles

 $4 - 1\frac{3}{4}$ " squares

Medium 6 - 2%'' squares cut diagonally once to make 12 'large' triangles

Dark

6 – 2" squares cut diagonally once to make 12 'small' triangles

Construct the foundation units. Press each well with a stabilizing spray. Trim outside edges along the dashed line placing the quarter inch line of your ruler on the straight line of the pattern to create accurate $\frac{1}{2}$ seam allowances. Remove the foundation paper.

Sew the A Units together forming a pinwheel with the large light fabric triangles as shown in the foundation pattern layout. Press the seam open. Add a B Unit to opposite sides of the pinwheel square. Press seams away from the center. Add remaining units and press similarly.

Give the block a final, crisp press with starch, square up if necessary and celebrate!
