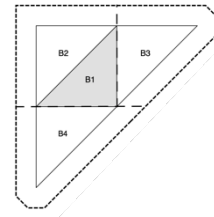
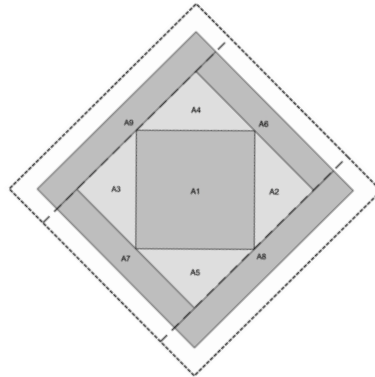
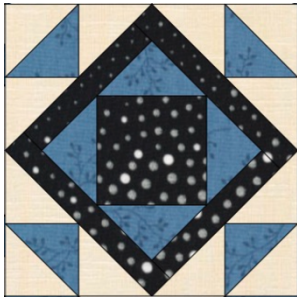

Miniature Block of the Month 2022

Block 8 Jack in the Pulpit

General Paper Piecing Preparation documentation can be found on the introduction page of the 2022 Mini BOM tab at sunsetcountryquilters.org.

The Jack in the Pulpit is made from a center block on point and 4 identical triangle units, one on each corner. All the fabric pieces are cut from squares and strips, so no templates are needed. You will be pleased with how quickly this block comes together!



If you are using alternating Light background fabrics, the background in this block is #2.

Light (**Background #2**)

6 – 2¼" squares cut diagonally once to make 12 triangles for the B Units

Medium

4 – 2¼" squares cut diagonally once to make 8 triangles: 4 for the center block (Unit A) and 4 for the corner triangles (Unit B)

Dark

1 – 2¼" square for the center of Unit A

4 – 1¼" x 4" strips for Unit A

Construct the foundation units. Press each well with a stabilizing spray. Trim outside edges along the dashed line placing the quarter inch line of your ruler on the straight line of the pattern to create accurate ¼" seam allowances. Remove the foundation paper.

Sew a Unit B to opposite sides of Unit A. Press the seams toward the center block. Add the remaining Unit B segments and press seams away from the center.

Give the block a final, crisp press with starch, square up by cutting off any 'dog ears' and celebrate!
