
Sunset Country Quilters' Guild Miniature Block of the Month 2022

Block 9 Night and Noon

General Paper Piecing Preparation documentation can be found on the introduction page of the 2022 Mini BOM tab at sunsetcountryquilters.org.

Night and Noon appears to be a nine-patch Ohio Star with strip pieced corners but is actually constructed from a center square-in-a-square on point and 2 versions of pieced setting triangle units. You'll notice a few similarities with our previous block.





Light (Background #1)

- 4-2% squares cut diagonally once to make 4 triangles for Unit A and 2 for each Unit C
- 2-1% squares cut diagonally once to make 1 small triangle for each Unit B and Unit C sections
- $4 1'' \times 2\%''$ strips: 1 for each Unit B and Unit C sections

Medium

- 1 2" square for the center of Unit A
- $4 1'' \times 2\%''$ strips: 1 for each Unit B and Unit C sections

Dark

- $4 2\frac{1}{4}$ " squares cut diagonally once to make 2 triangles for each Unit B and Unit C sections
- 2 2" squares cut diagonally once to make 1 small triangle for each Unit B and Unit C sections

Construct the foundation units. Press each well with a stabilizing spray. Trim outside edges along the dashed line placing the quarter inch line of your ruler on the straight line of the pattern to create accurate $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances. Remove the foundation paper.

Sew a Unit B to opposite sides of Unit A ensuring the bulk of the seam allowances lies opposite. Press the seams toward the center block. Add the remaining Unit C sections and press seams away from the center.

Give the block a final, crisp press with starch, square up by cutting off any 'dog ears' and celebrate!
